There has been so much super learning going on throughout our school and a real sense of our learning behaviours permeating classrooms throughout school. This week, one of our Elephant Class arrived at school with some writing he had done before school which included the words: 'It is Monday today and I am going to be reflective!'. Wow what a super attitude towards learning!



The snow on Friday brought with it a lovely opportunity to play in the snow. The children arrived wrapped up warm ready for a morning of snowman building competitions followed by hot chocolate and biscuits in the warm! A huge thank you to heroic Mr Stemp for taking such good care of our pathways around school over the last couple of weeks to make sure they are safe for us all. It was lovely to be able to share the excitement of the snow with your children and to see them playing with their friends. Snowy days are a lovely opportunity to make memories that will be talked about for a long time to come!



We were delighted to welcome Amanda Worne into school on Monday to help us **HOOK** the children into their 'reflective fortnight' spent contributing to their mid-year learning reports. You may have seen Amanda recently appearing on DIY SOS. Amanda was a

marathon-running mum in the middle of Ironman training when she had an accident which changed her life forever. Her outlook on life and the book she has written 'The Sky is Not the Limit' sees the values of courage, determination and positivity shine through her approach to everyday life. Amanda led an inspiring assembly during which she shared some of her experiences before leading workshops in Penguin, Tiger and Meerkats classes. Some of the principles by which she copes with the challenges in her life are:

*No man is an island... ask for help! *Try new things and go out of your comfort

zone. *Make new friends and put faith in those

around you. *Value those who matter, especially family.

*Consider the perspective of others, help those who are less fortunate. *We are all special!

*Celebrate what you have. Live for today! Amanda's book, The Sky is not the Limit, is in our entrance hall for the children to look at. Please do feel free to pop in and have a look too!

The children are now hard at work on their reports and it's been lovely to hear some of their reflections on themselves as

Safer Internet Day (SID) was marked this week with a whole-school learning experience in which each class explored a theme:

Penguin class: Can I have fun online? Koala class: Do I need to be careful online?

Panther class: Think before you share. Tiger class: Protect your stuff. Meerkat class: Respect each other online. Panda class: When in doubt, discuss. Throughout the morning, the children were immersed in discussions and learning about their key area and during the

afternoon they wrote a PLEDGE, committing themselves to taking action in some way to keeping themselves safer online. These pledges are now on display in the ICT Suite and there as a visual reminder to children and adults of our commitment to making the Internet a safer place for everybody to be.

Our staff team have also had training this week in school to develop their understanding of supporting young people with accessing the internet safely. Teachers and governors from across our locality of schools met together at Bishop Luffa on Wednesday evening to hear the latest updates on the issues and challenges our young people face and how to educate them to make the right choices and discuss their worries when they need to.



Examples of SID Pledges from Fishbourne Primary:

I can have fun online and I can stay safe by not telling strangers my name and age. (Year 1) I promise not to go on the internet without

telling a grown up. I promise I won't go on the internet and talk to people who I don't know. (Year 2) I pledge to make a robust and locked password to keep my identity safe. It will also keep my private things safe. It will use symbols, letters and numbers. (Year 4) Online, I always try my best to maintain my pledge to be civil to other internet users and be positive, never-ever negative, towards other people. (Year 5) I pledge to always tell a trusted adult if I see any inappropriate content or language online (this could include cyber-bullying). I will notify an adult immediately. (Year 6)

In our January newsletter, we mentioned the work we are undertaking in our School Development Plan on maths. We greatly enjoyed the INSET training led by Sam Parkes from the University of Chichester and were really inspired by some of the ideas she shared. Our class teachers are currently experimenting with some of these ideas in the classroom. If you are interested to know more, we highly recommend watching these TED Talks which have inspired us to think differently. In the afternoon we are heading back to school and teachers will have time to get cracking on writing their responses to the children's school reports.
